On that basis, Ministers welcome Belarus as a member of the EHEA and look forward to working with the national authorities and **stakeholders** to implement the reforms identified by the BFUG and included in the agreed road map attached to Belarusian accession

Yerevan Communique 2015

Belarus joined the EHEA in 2015 on the basis of an agreed roadmap. We acknowledge that some first reforms have been initiated, but also that substantial challenges remain. We welcome Belarus' commitment to work with and be supported by partners in the implementation of the proposed strategy for 2018-2020.

Paris Communique 2018

Why does Belarus have a special treatment?

Officially: only country which joined after EHEA was established

Really: not ready to fulfill the criteria

And now it is a matter of credibility

Fundamental values:

Institutional autonomy

Academic freedom

Participation of stakeholders

Transparency

Figure 1.16: Decision making regarding the development of new higher education programmes, 2017





Figure 3.18: Scorecard indicator n°2: Stage of implementation of the Diploma Supplement, 2016/17




